



Town Report

JULY, 2016

- On July 21, the Placer County Board of Supervisors approved the lease agreement for the Library building in Loomis. The Town and Loomis Friends of the Library are working with Placer County staff on the transition of the building to the Town
- Staff continues to work on a schedule to install the metal artwork on the Horseshoe Bar overpass. The Artwork is currently being manufactured. Installation is requiring extensive coordination with Caltrans.
- Staff is working on responding to comments received on the Village Draft EIR. Over 400 comments were received during the comment period. Staff is also working on a Development Agreement between the Developer and the Town .
- The Friday Night Family fests and summer concert series have begun and have been a big success,

Parks, Landscaping, and buildings

- Installed sensor for the spray pad's "On" switch, and replaced the timer at the Blue Anchor Park.
- Built large box for residents to pick up chips from our tree trimmings at the Corp Yard.
- Replaced sprinkler valve at the Sunrise Loomis Park.
- Replaced 3 trees in the Multi-Modal parking lot.
- Fixed leaking sprinklers in the landscaping across from Shell Gas Station.
- Replaced and adjusted sprinkler heads in the grass at the Blue Anchor Park.
- Replaced sprinkler valve in the Multi-Modal landscaping.
- Cut tall weeds around the Corp Yard.
- Set up a bike locker and loaded it with barricades for the Friday Night Family Fest.
- Cut tall grass around the Peter Oaks stage for upcoming events.
- Replaced a sprinkler and solenoid at the Sunrise Loomis Park.
- Maintained and adjusted the sprinklers at Sunrise Loomis Park, and the Blue Anchor Park.
- Cleaned and organized the metal piles, wood piles, shipping containers, and storage area at the Corp Yard.
- Put up a "Summer Concert" banner in front of the Train Depot.
- Ground down several tripping hazards in the sidewalks at the Sunrise Loomis Park.

Streets

- Erected large "Taste of Loomis" banner across Taylor Rd.
- Cut and chipped large branch that had fallen near 4984 King Rd.

- Several political signs were taken down, which were obstructing driver's views on the South- West corner of Taylor Rd and Sierra College Blvd.
- On the South end of Bankhead Rd, tall weeds were cut and AB was added to widen the road, which would allow cars to turn around safely.
- Replaced broken glass and panel in the bus shelter across from Spec West on Taylor Rd.
- Replaced a stop sign on Walnut St at Taylor Rd, a stop sign on Brace Rd at Horseshoe Bar Rd, a stop sign on Rocklin Rd at Barton Rd, and a stop ahead sign on Barton Rd near Rocklin Rd.
- Eliminated graffiti painted in the road on Brace Rd at Horseshoe Bar Rd.
- Patched large pothole on Horseshoe Bar Rd near Secret Ravine.
- Cut tall weeds on the corner of King Rd and Swetzer Rd, around the bike paths on Humphrey Rd, and in the median at Taylor Rd and Rippey Rd for visibility.
- Cut down small tree hanging in the road on Brace Rd at Secret Ravine.
- Ground down several trip hazards in front of Town Hall.
- Replaced three delineators on Taylor Rd, and one on Horseshoe Bar Rd.
- Repaired equestrian path on Rutherford Canyon Rd, by adding D.G. and compacting it.
- Erected large "Friday Night Family Fest" banner across Taylor Rd.
- Picked up large branches that fell on Taylor Rd, and at Sunrise Loomis Park.
- Made and installed sign for the spray pad hours of operation.
- Mowed tall grass in the field across from the Memorial Hall for future events parking.
- Took down Spring banners on Horseshoe Bar Rd, then put up Summer banners.
- Cut trees limbs hanging in the road on Delmar Ave.
- Cut tree limbs covering signs on King Rd, Bankhead Rd, Sierra College Blvd, Taylor Rd, Rippey Rd, and Thornwood Dr.
- Installed a "No Left Turn" sign at the North-East entrance/exit of Taylor's parking lot, to eliminate cars from blocking traffic.

Inspections

- Received Inspection from Placer County Health and Human Services (Environmental Health Division).
- Inspected various grading permits, encroachment permits, and erosion control.
- Marked 60 USAs throughout town.

Equipment and vehicle maintenance

- The Chevy 1500 had the starter replaced, and the F-350 had the ignition replaced.
- Sharpened chains on the chainsaw blades.

PW Crew

- Met with the Placer County Public Works to coordinate with each other in the future.
- Attended a webinar on Electrical Safety.
- Attended a webinar on Confined Spaces.

Public Works Director

- Worked with Placer County, Roseville, Rocklin, Lincoln and Auburn on four workshops throughout Placer County to inform residents and property owners on the updates to the Flood Insurance Rate Map from FEMA.

- Met with individual businesses and property owners to discuss the Downtown Implementation Plan.
- Negotiated an agreement with Union Pacific for the Webb Street Improvements.
- Attended coordination meetings with our local agency partners.
