



TOWN COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS FOR MAY

Mayor Rhonda Morillas

1. **Placer County Flood Control/Water Conservation District** – There was no meeting this month.

Councilmember Brian Baker:

1. **Placer County Economic Development Commission** – They had a presentation about the CSUS/Sierra proposed campus in Roseville.

Councilmember Robert Black:

1. **Placer County Air Pollution Control District** – Grants were issued to various applicants for Air Pollution savings.
2. **School Liaison** – They met with Loomis School Superintendent Gordon Medd and Del Oro High School Principal Dan Gayaldo to discuss student leaders to interact with town council.
3. **Business Liaison** – They will be meeting with the Chamber this month.

Councilmember Miguel Ucovich:

1. **Local Agency Formation Commission** – They discussed the following:
 - Contracting to do an EIR for the proposed Town of Olympic Village. Requested that the contract payment schedule be done as work is completed rather than the total amount be paid up front.
 - They received a report on the status of municipal service studies for Eastern Placer County.
 - Received an update on state legislation affecting LAFCO agencies.

Councilmember Dave Wheeler

1. **2x2 Committee** – the committee met with the developers involved in the sewer bypass line and discussed funding methods, the environmental study, alignment of the proposed sewer line, and the timeline.
2. **SACOG** – the Board took action and gave policy direction on the following:
 - approved the draft “Preferred Scenario for the 2016 Metropolitan Transportation Plan/Sustainable Communities Strategy
 - approved the “Policy Frameworks” for the 2015 SACOG four-county Flexible Funding Round and six-county Regional Active Transportation Program.
 - the Budget and Overall Work Program was approved to release for public comment.
 - the Board and staff worked with the Chamber’s staff and volunteer leadership to develop policy issue papers and advocacy appointments with the region’s funding levels for transportation, including airports, crude oil by rail safety and goods movement.
 - the Board discussed new technology to support public access to SACOG Board meetings on SACOG’s website.
