Councilmember Robert Black:

Placer County Air Pollution Control District – The board is set to meet on April 14th, and an agenda has not been provided yet.

School Liaison – No meetings held during the last 30 days.

Business Liaison – I met with the Chamber of Commerce and their Economic Development Committee. Discussions were on business retention and the next business walk scheduled for 4-26. Also challenges with opening new businesses in Loomis, local residents perception of commercial space available, branding of the Town, feedback from educational seminars and training, the Loomis Town Center Implementation Plan update, and the downtown business association.

LAFCO – LAFCO denied Rocklin's annexation request for area east of Interstate 80 due to the fact that it is agricultural and must go to a vote of the residents.

SACOG

- The SACOG Board approved the programming process for the Earned (\$23.6 million) and Discretionary Shares (\$6.4 million) of funding available from Federal Transit Administration Sections 5307 and 5339. The criteria used to evaluate the Discretionary applicants are consistent with the policies of the 2016 Metropolitan Transportation Plan/Sustainable Communities Strategy (MTP/SCS). A call for projects for the Discretionary share in the Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Plan (MTIP) will capture transit project applications.
- Santa Monica, San Diego, Los Angeles, Chicago, Salt Lake City and Washington D.C. are among cities with Bike Share systems in the USA. The Sacramento region is on schedule to join them in 2017. Staff presented the Bike Share System Update (presentation) at the March Board Meeting. The Bike Share Policy Steering Committee for the SACOG region, with representatives from the cities of Davis, Sacramento and West Sacramento, and the Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District is working collaboratively to secure funding to operate the system and have recommended SACOG to operate the system.
